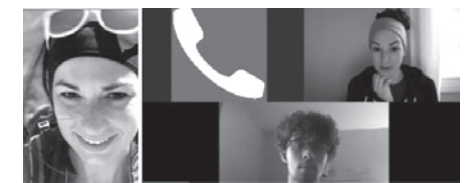

END-OF-YEAR HIGHLIGHTS

Preschool Butterflies

Gardening at Barclay

Mrs. Quigley and Mrs. Underwood's third-grade students learned about gardening this spring. Students planted flowers and beans in the classroom to learn about plants and see how they grow. They then weeded around the school and planted sunflowers and marigolds to brighten the courtyard. High school student Jeffrey Xue and OMS teacher John Akers discussed food scarcity with the students, highlighted the local, not-for-profit they started (East Coast Food Conservation Organization) and explained the benefit of community gardens.



Motivational Bracelets Unite

Students in Oliver Middle School practiced random acts of kindness by making motivational friendship bracelets for Barclay students. The seventh-grade students researched how to make the bracelets, added friendship pins and included motivational notes. The second-grade students loved the kindness that was shown to them, and their older classmates enjoyed knowing they made someone's day!



Hill Students Create Solar Ovens

Fourth and fifth-grade STEM students learned about energy conversion by designing and creating solar ovens using pizza boxes. Students first learned about solar power and energy, then brainstormed what materials would reflect light and which would absorb light and heat. Students were given seven choices on materials to build their ovens. They were allowed to select three or less and worked to determine where best to place each material. The ovens were tested, then designs were improved based on their observations.

Remembrance Row

Since 2002, the Hill School Outdoor Education Club has planted trees on the north side of the school and called it Remembrance Row. Memorial Day Ceremony

Brockport Central honored those who defended our country during Oliver Middle School's annual Memorial Day Ceremony. Local veterans were guests of honor and joined Brockport students and staff in remembrance of deceased soldiers from the area, as names were read and the OMS band played.



Therapy Dogs at BHS

Brockport High School had the opportunity to pre-pilot a therapy dog service with Mari the therapy dog this spring. Mari and her handler visited Mr. Geary's AP Psychology classes to demonstrate to the students what a therapy dog does and the benefits they have on a person's mental health. Although this is a pilot program, the school hopes to expand and make it a permanent part of the psychology program.



OMS Makes Music

OMS chorus teacher, Ms. Lancia, received a grant for the school's choral music project. The sixth-grade chorus group worked with Dr. Carrie Magin, a theory and composition professor at Houghton College, to develop a unique musical piece. Dr. Magin brainstormed ideas for the song with the chorus. Students answered the following questions in order to come up with the lyrics:

1. Name something that you are grateful for.
2. Describe an image of something important to you or that has brought you joy.
3. Name a challenge you have had to overcome.
4. Choose one word that describes something that has given you strength.

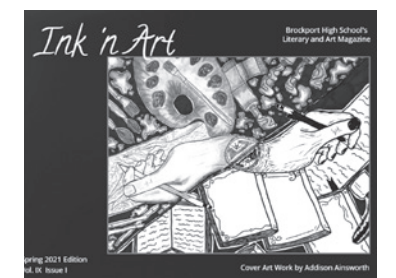

Happy summer!! Although summer vacation is a time to relax and rejuvenate, we hope your student will dedicate some time to reading.

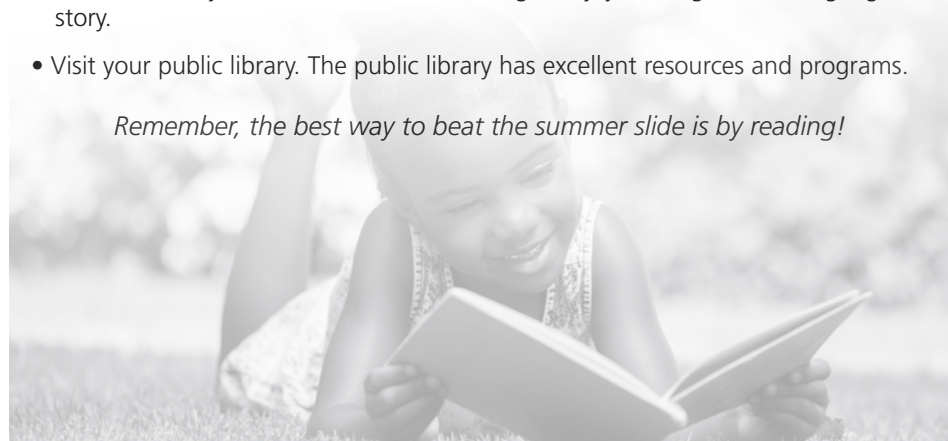
Did you know that summer reading is essential to maintaining all students' school-year academic success? According to the book, *No More Summer Reading Loss*, "...the only summer activity related to improving reading achievement is summer reading."

Studies show that the effect of reading four or five books over the summer months can prevent a decline in reading from spring to fall. To help students maintain the success they worked so hard to achieve, we encourage you to include reading as one of your summer activities. The suggested summer reading lists can be found on the District's website (https://bcs1.org/news/what_s_new/summer_reading) and can assist you in selecting books for your students.

Some tips to consider:

- Search for books that feature characters with different backgrounds, experiences and identities in order to learn about other people's lives and stories. This will teach children the importance of empathy and kindness.
- Choice is huge! Students respond better to reading when they have a choice in the reading material.
- Read aloud to your child. Children of ALL ages enjoy hearing and sharing a good story.
- Visit your public library. The public library has excellent resources and programs.

Remember, the best way to beat the summer slide is by reading!



EQUITY and Inclusion

An equity and inclusion survey was administered by the District this spring, as part of the Diversity and Inclusion Strategic Plan. The goal of the survey was to capture a snapshot of the District's needs regarding equity and inclusion and provide evidence of the work we are doing, as well as areas in need of improvement.

The next steps being taken by the Equity Audit Committee are to examine the information gathered to highlight the District's successes and look for potential gaps so that a plan can be formulated that will meet the needs of our school, students and staff. Professional Development opportunities will also be identified for staff members.

The committee will begin auditing the library resources and High School English Language Arts resources through a lens of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion this summer. In addition, planning will begin for various diversity, equity and inclusion events throughout the District for the upcoming school year.

Broughton Named Director of Learning and Staff Development

After an extensive interview process, BCSD selected Brandon Broughton as the District's Director of Learning and Staff Development. Mr. Broughton's appointment was approved by Brockport's Board of Education in May, and he started his new position this summer.



Brandon began his career in education in Brockport, teaching at the Hill School for eleven years. He then served as an assistant principal for three years before being promoted to principal, where he has served for the last six years.

"Having worked in the District for twenty years, and also being a resident, I am very invested in the success of our schools and look forward to contributing to our continuous improvement," says Broughton. "I am very proud of the work we have done at Hill School and grateful for all the wonderful relationships and memories I have from my time there. In all my different experiences at Hill School, student learning has always been at the forefront of my focus, and I look forward to bringing that perspective to my new role."

"We are very excited to have Brandon take on this new role within our District," says Superintendent Sean Bruno. "Throughout Brandon's tenure at Brockport, he has built strong working relationships with students, faculty, staff, colleagues and parents. His proven ability to positively and collaboratively move staff toward meeting school and district goals will be one of his many strengths as he transitions into this PK-12 position."

Unified Sports

The 2020-21 school year was a year of adaptation, perseverance and resiliency. Our Unified athletes, coaches, families and volunteers rose to the many challenges presented during the pandemic. Despite the restrictions, our unified teams worked together, played hard and had phenomenal seasons!

Brockport's Unified Bowling started in the fall of 2019. "Athletes of all abilities practiced, learned, grew, laughed, cheered each other on and came away with an undefeated season," said Jennifer Fredericks, Special Education Teacher and Unified Coach. Although the bowling season was delayed this year and safety precautions were put in place, "our athletes came together and picked up right where they left off." This year we had twelve athletes, some were new to the program and some were returning members. The team offered a familiar



outlet for students during the uncertainty of COVID, and they look forward to another- hopefully undefeated- season in the 2021-2022 school year!

Unified Basketball returned with an in-person season this spring, after competing virtually during COVID last year. The group was comprised of 14 players who came together and developed strong bonds as a team. "Having the season later in the school year was helpful because some of the restrictions lifted, so it (was) nice to have spectators at the games and be able to continue our halftime dance celebrations," says Fredericks, who also coaches the basketball team. "One of the things that is unique to Unified is the focus on having fun and including everyone- even the crowd- in that fun. Our team really feeds off the energy."



Fredericks stated the coaches saw major growth in skills among the players. They continued to push themselves outside their comfort zones and improved their basketball skills. The season ended with senior night, where seniors on the team were recognized at the beginning of the game and players at halftime had a chance to throw a pie in BHS Principal Mike Pincelli's face, as part of the traditional Unified ceremony.

"What is amazing about the Unified Sports programs at Brockport, is that whether you are new or someone who has been involved for a while, you are included," says Fredericks. "New relationships formed and old ones were rekindled." Despite a pandemic, our Unified sports seasons thrived. Skills were developed, friendships were made and confidence was gained – a win for everyone!

The Brockport Continuing Education program is a self-sustaining program funded by enrollment fees. Since we rely solely on course fees, it is necessary to maintain minimum registration requirements. Please know that classes not meeting minimum registration requirements may be canceled. Notifications for class cancellations due to limited registration will be made prior to first class sessions, and refunds will be issued. Please know that class registration fees do not include the cost of books, materials or supplies, unless noted in class descriptions.

All checks must be made payable to: Brockport Continuing Education. Our office must receive your registration form and payment one week prior to first day of class/session unless a specific deadline is noted. Please remember that prompt registration may reduce the likelihood of classes being canceled due to low enrollment. You must be 18 years of age or older to be eligible to register, with the exception of those courses designed specifically for younger participants.

REFUNDS, CANCELLATIONS & CONFIRMATION:

Refunds are provided only if a student withdraws from the class 24 hours prior to the scheduled start date. No refunds will be provided after the first class. If you join a class after the scheduled start date, the tuition will be the same amount. If a class needs to be canceled due to maintenance or weather emergencies, no partial refund will be issued. **Refunds will be processed for courses that have been fully canceled from our schedule for reasons such as low enrollment.** Fees for registration do not include the cost of books, materials or supplies, unless noted.

If a onetime only class is canceled due to weather or emergency and not able to be rescheduled, a refund may be offered. No continuing education classes are held when Brockport schools are closed due to weather cancellations or emergency conditions. The fall semester will begin the week of Monday, September 13, 2021. **If you do not receive a notification of cancellation, your class will be held. No confirmations are sent.**

Enrolled students will receive instruction in the classroom, behind the wheel and on the road, as required by New York State Department of Motor Vehicles. Those successfully completing the class will receive an MV285 certificate that gives the holder the privilege to receive a Class D operator's license when reaching age 17, allowing them to drive after 9 p.m. Students must be 16 years old and hold a valid NYS Driver Permit or License to be eligible for the course. The Pre-Licensing 5-Hour Course material is included in Driver Education. The loan of a text is included in the class fee.

Most insurance companies will offer a discount on compulsory car insurance upon request.

Classroom instruction: ALL students must attend ALL classroom instruction in the Brockport High School Room 192.

Please note: Student must be present for the first theory class to be allowed entry into the course. Please arrive 15 minutes prior to the start of the first class. (Late arrivals will not be admitted and, if registered, will forfeit course enrollment). No early dismissals from theory class allowed.

Students must have the following for theory class:

- Permit/license
- NYS Driver Manual
- Notebook/folder
- Writing materials

Students must be prepared with the following for each car class:

- Permit/license
- Sunglasses are encouraged
- Appropriate footwear (i.e. no backless sandals)

Driving groups: will start and end at the east-side (pool) parking lot of the high school. Driving classes may be rescheduled at the instructor's discretion due to inclement weather. Should a make-up driving class be requested by a student due to extenuating circumstances, the instructor will reschedule at his discretion. Driving groups may be rescheduled to place four drivers in each time block. Every effort will be made to accommodate rescheduling conflicts. However, the instructor reserves the right to create a schedule that is most effective in terms of number of students scheduled for each driving group. Scheduling of, or transportation to, the road test are not included. Parents or other qualified adults should plan to devote time for enrolled students to practice the skills learned in this class. Only experience and good judgment will make a safe driver. A current NYS Learner's Permit must be brought to all classes.

Registration directions: Please send your payment, completed registration form and a copy of the student's learner's permit to the address listed below. **The cost is \$470 for residents, \$490 for non-residents.** The registration deadline for Session I will end September 2, 2021, and the session deadline for Session II will end January 21, 2022. **Please select your drive groups, listing your choices in order of preference. First priority will be given to resident seniors, then resident juniors, then underclassmen and non-residents. Every effort will be made to accommodate your request.** You will be notified by e-mail or telephone, and a list will be posted in the High School if you have been accepted and enrolled. Safe Driving Techniques (Five-Hour Course)

The NYS Bureau of Motor Vehicles requires five hours of classroom instruction as a prerequisite for obtaining a driver's license. Applicants affected by this regulation are those applying for a first-time driver's license; those applying for a driver's license because of a lapse of a one-year renewal grace period; and those applying for a new license as a result of revocation of a previous license. The five-hour training period must be completed prior to the applicant applying for a road test. Persons having completed a regular driving education course do NOT need this program.

The following regulations are applicable to all prospective registrants:

- Registration must be completed by mailing the registration form or in person at Oliver Middle School by noon the Tuesday immediately preceding the class. There is a seven-person minimum to hold this class. Registering on time reduces the risk of cancellation.
- Students will be admitted on a first-come, first-served basis.

- Applicants must be 16 years of age or older.
- Applicants must bring their valid learner's permit to register.
- Applicants must pay the \$40 registration fee upon registering and completely fill out the registration form.

An official completion certificate, which is valid for one year from the day of issuance, will be given upon completion of the five-hour program. This certificate must be presented when applying for a road test. It does not qualify participants for reduced insurance rates.
