

BROCKPORT ACCEPTS RACHEL'S CHALLENGE

Brockport Central School District is working with Rachel's Challenge, an organization born from the Columbine tragedy, whose mission includes "building connections, hope and resilience, while improving school culture so that students are able to reach their full potential academically, socially and emotionally." Given the experiences over the last several years, the District believes this is the ideal opportunity to reestablish prioritizing relationships as the most effective path to realizing its vision, mission, core beliefs and goals.

Using the remarkable story of Rachel Scott, the first victim of the Columbine High School tragedy, Rachel's Challenge awakens individual hope and purpose, which in turn promotes safer, more connected school communities. This tragic, yet inspiring, story illustrates how deliberately reaching out to others with kind words and small acts of kindness can have a life-changing impact.

In September, the District held presentations for staff and families to hear Rachel's story and how the District would implement the program. Rachel's Challenge was shared with students in grades 6-12 through age and content-appropriate assemblies. Students inspired

to spread kindness and promote a positive mind-set volunteered to attend various chain reaction workshops.

The Chain Reaction Events are transformational days of fun, leadership and power that can change the way people view one another forever. The goal of Chain Reaction is to help stop the teasing, violence and alienation that is so deeply a part of the school experience for millions of young people every day. Through a variety of games, trust-building activities and presentations, students and staff were given a unique opportunity to see themselves and the people around them through a new set of eyes. Both Oliver Middle School and Brockport High School have developed a Friends of Rachel Club that has started to meet and will

continue to spread the message of kindness and compassion throughout our school community.

In just over two decades of social-emotional and mental health training, Rachel's Challenge has reached over 30 million students, educators and community members. Its programs, along with the existing efforts of the schools, have helped to sustain a culture where harassment, violence and self-harm are reduced; where teachers are free to teach, and students are empowered to learn.

“Rachel's Challenge works to turn the ideals of kindness and compassion into actionable strategies that help promote a safe and productive learning environment,” said Brockport Superintendent Sean Bruno. “We look forward to working as a team to inspire and empower our students to affect permanent, positive change within our District and community through their continued actions and words.”

John (Jack) Milner, a long-time educator and former A.D. Oliver Middle School Principal, was presented with the James C. Fallon Distinguished Service Award during the October 18, 2022 Brockport Board of Education meeting.

Mr. Milner spent time in the Holley, Churchville-Chili and Brockport Central School Districts for 33 years before retiring in 1999. He was hired by Brockport Central Schools in 1986 and served as the principal of Oliver Middle School from 1987 until 1999. Mr. Milner was nominated by John DeBaun, who described Mr. Milner as continuously thinking of creating betterment for children, serving on numerous school district committees to help achieve this.

There were numerous outstanding accomplishments throughout Mr. Milner's life, including both his time at Brockport Schools and his time as a Brockport community member, which led to his nomination and award.

- Mr. Milner coordinated the Oliver Middle School renovation and continues to provide tours of the school during class reunions.
- Helped co-found Westside Challenger Baseball and Westside Challenger Tennis.
- Mr. Milner served as Sweden Town Supervisor, during which time he formed the Brockport Fire District.
- He is a charter member of the Sweden Community Foundation Board, of which he was president from 2005-2018 and has served as vice president since 2018.
- Mr. Milner served as President of the Monroe County Public School Athletic Association from 1992-1996 and was named President again in 2002, which he served until he stepped down in 2021.
- He served as the BOCES Administrative Representative for Middle School Education with the State Education Department from 1995-1999.

Emergency Procedure Review

The safety and security of students and staff remains a priority at Brockport Central School District. Each year we review our emergency policies and procedures to ensure students, staff and families know how to respond in the event of an emergency.

Automated Messaging

The district uses SchoolMessenger, an automated messaging system, to quickly communicate with families via phone and email. In the event of an emergency, such as a lockout or lockdown, calls will be made to all parent/guardian's home, work and cell phone numbers, along with emergency contacts 1-4 listed on the Student Profile Form updated every September (or when there is a change in contact information). The text of the messages will also be sent via email. Additionally, those who have downloaded the Brockport CSD mobile application will be notified via a push notification. If you do not have the mobile app and would like to download it, search for "Brockport Central" in your device's app store.

The district will periodically use the automated messaging system to share other important information such as open house reminders or last-minute event changes. Information classified as "non-emergency" will be sent only to the primary home phone numbers and email addresses on file.

Website Alerts

Additional information during emergency situations will also be posted on the district's website and social media accounts when deemed appropriate. You may find the information on our website at bcs1.org or by searching @brockportcsd on Facebook or Twitter. Please remember to check these resources and refrain from calling your child's school in the event of an emergency so district personnel can focus their attention on the safety of students.

Lockouts and Lockdowns

People often use the terms lockout and lockdown interchangeably. At BCSD, a lockout is initiated when there is a potential risk outside the building or district (*i.e., an armed person is threatening the community; a suspicious condition, chemical spill or rabid/aggressive animal exists in the area*). During a lockout, exterior doors and windows are locked, outside activities are terminated and instruction continues as normal inside the building.

A lockdown is initiated when there is an impending risk to the building or district (*i.e., an armed/violent/aggressive person threatening or attacking a school building or the district; an imminent threat that may involve a specific building or the district*). In this case, the same protocols would be followed for a lockout, however, classroom doors are locked and instruction is halted.

How to Help During Emergency Situations

- Listen carefully to automated phone calls and messages you receive. Please listen to the entire message, then visit the district's website for more information at www.bcs1.org.
- Don't panic. Just like you, we make your children's safety our main priority. We have solid procedures in place to keep them safe. We practice emergency drills multiple times each year with our students and staff and consistently review our safety procedures.
- Avoid calling your child's school. We will notify you as more information becomes available.
- Don't rush to campus. If there is an actual emergency on our campus where law enforcement or emergency personnel need to respond, it is critical to keep the campus clear so they can quickly resolve the situation.
- Keep your contact information up-to-date. It is important to have a current email address on file in addition to home, work and cell phone numbers.

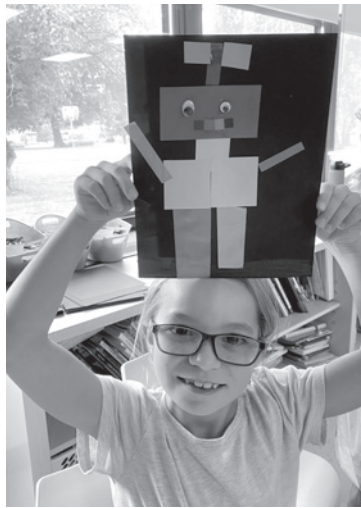


Full-Day PreK

Brockport CSD expanded our successful half-day pre-kindergarten program to include one full-day pre-k pilot classroom this year. This new program offers a proportional expansion of our current pre-k curriculum, which primarily provides developmental and social emotional learning and growth. The full-day program also includes the opportunity for breakfast and lunch, as well as snack and nap time. We hope the success of this full-day expansion results in additional full-day classrooms next year and eventually includes student transportation.

Artists Create in Barclay

Barclay students spent time this fall exploring "Creation Invitation" in art class. Students were given a variety of collage and drawing materials to create an individual piece of art. Second grade students made creations themed Under the Sea, and students in third grade classes created artwork in a Robot Lab.



Hill Students Discuss Respect

Students in Ms. Corner's class participated in a Respect Agreement lesson as part of the Social-Emotional Lesson (SEL) program, PurposeFull People. This program is intended to build healthy and helpful connections with teachers and classmates. Students talked about how they wanted to be treated and how they should treat others. They also discussed ways they felt materials, and different areas in the classroom, should be treated with respect. In small groups, they decided on key items for each of the different areas. After listening to ideas from each group, students worked together to determine what should be included in the classroom Respect Agreement, which now hangs as a poster in the classroom.



OMS Students Explore Technology

In partnership with BOCES 2, once a month Oliver Middle School receives a new Makerspace activity for students. Sometimes the activities are more hi-tech, the 3D printers, Ozobots, working with circuits, etc. while other times, they are low-tech, such as Keva planks activity. No matter the technology involved, the Makerspace activities encourage students to think outside the box, think creatively and problem solve together. Students are encouraged to explore on their own, with a partner or a small group and are encouraged to use Makerspace whenever they have flex-time in their schedules.



Lunch on the Lawn at BHS

Students and staff at Brockport High School had the opportunity to eat outside during Lunch on the Lawn at the end of September, spending time with friends while enjoying music, snacks and lawn games. National School Bus Safety Week



Held during the third full week of October each year, the National School Bus Safety Week is an active public education program aimed at addressing school bus safety. This year's theme is **1 Bus + 1 Driver = a BIG Impact on Education.**

Here are a few tips from the National Association for Pupil Transportation to keep our children safe:

Walking to the Bus Stop

- Walk young children to the bus stop
- Encourage children to walk in groups. There is safety in numbers, and groups are easier for drivers to see.
- Practice good pedestrian behavior: walk on the sidewalk, if there is no sidewalk stay out of the street. If you must walk in the street, walk single file, face traffic and stay close to the edge of the road.

- Stop and look left, right and then left again if you must cross the street or driveway.

Getting On and Off the Bus

- Warn children that if they drop something getting on or off the bus, they should never pick it up. Instead, they should tell the driver and follow the driver's instructions.
- Remind children to look to the right before they step off the bus.
- If you meet your child at the bus stop after school, wait on the side where the child will be dropped off, not across the street. Children can be so excited to see you after school that they dash across the street and forget the safety rules.

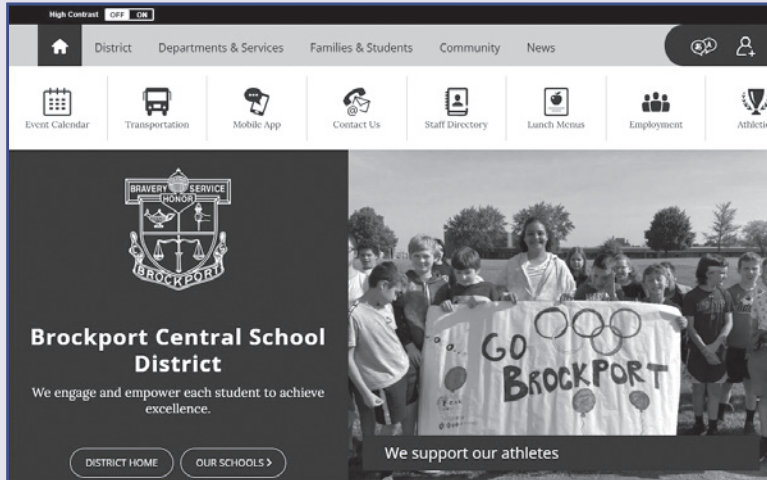
