It was determined a \$3000 scholarship would be awarded annually to a deserving senior: who will be attending a college of their choice, has high moral character, and a well-rounded background in academics and activities outside of the classroom - indicative of leadership potential.

He currently practices as a Clinical Associate Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Rochester Medical Center and Golisano Children’s Hospital and is the school physician for the Brockport and Holley Central School districts.

The Board of Education and I are honored to extend our heartfelt appreciation to Dr. Goetz for his continued unwavering commitment and remarkable service throughout the years,” said Superintendent Sean C. Bruno. “Dr. Goetz has been a beacon of compassion, providing not just medical expertise but also a comforting presence that has touched the lives of countless students, staff, and families. His tireless efforts, professionalism, and genuine care continues to leave an indelible mark on our District.”

Mr. Fallon began his journey in 1970 working as a fourth-grade teacher in our District before stepping into various administrative roles. He then served as our Superintendent for 16 years before retiring in 2009.

Nominees must possess:

- a confident, expert-level knowledge in a given field;
- wisdom, leading to effective judgement based in transparency and empathy;

Barclay PBIS Program Presents Barclay “Blue Day”

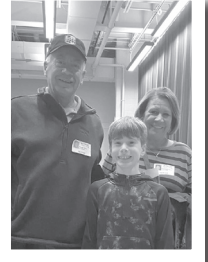

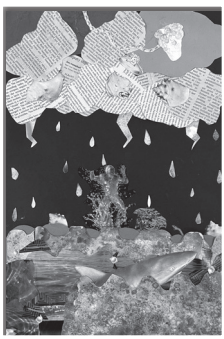

Emergency Procedure Review

The safety and security of students and staff remains a priority at Brockport Central School District. Each year we review our emergency policies and procedures to ensure students, staff and families know how to respond in the event of an emergency.

Automated Messaging

Our District uses an automated messaging system to quickly communicate with families via phone, text, and email. In the event of an emergency, such as a lockout or lockdown, calls will be made to all parent/guardian's home, work and cell phone numbers, along with emergency contacts 1-4 listed on the Student Profile Form updated every September (or when there is a change in contact information). The transcribed content of the messages will also be sent via email. Additionally, those who have downloaded the Brockport CSD mobile application will be notified via a push notification. If you do not have the mobile app and would like to download it, search for "Brockport Central" in your device's app store.

Our District may periodically use the automated messaging system to share other important information or last-minute event changes. Information classified as "non-emergency" will be primarily sent via email or text.

Website Alerts

Additional information during emergency situations will also be posted on our District website and social media accounts when deemed appropriate. You may find the information on our website at bcs1.org or by searching [@brockportcsd](https://www.facebook.com/brockportcsd) on Facebook or Twitter. Please remember to check these resources and refrain from calling your child's school in the event of an emergency so District personnel can focus their attention on the safety of students and communicating important information to families.

Lockouts and Lockdowns

People often use the terms lockout and lockdown interchangeably. At BCSD, a lockout is initiated when there is a potential risk outside the building or District (i.e., an armed person is threatening the community; a suspicious condition, chemical spill or rabid/ aggressive animal exists in the area). During a lockout, exterior doors and windows are locked, outside activities are terminated and instruction continues as normal inside the building.

A lockdown is initiated when there is an impending risk to the building or District (i.e., an armed/violent/aggressive person threatening or attacking a school building or the District; an imminent threat that may involve a specific building or the District). In this case, the same protocols would be followed for a lockout, however, classroom doors are locked and instruction is halted.

How to Help During Emergency Situations

- Listen carefully to automated phone calls and messages you receive. Please listen to the entire message, then visit our District website for more information at www.bcs1.org.
- Don't panic. Just like you, we make your children's safety our main priority. We have procedures in place to keep everyone as safe as possible. We practice emergency drills multiple times each year with our students and staff and consistently review our safety procedures.
- Avoid calling your child's school. We will notify you as more information becomes available.
- Don't rush to campus. If there is an actual emergency on our campus where law enforcement or emergency personnel need to respond, it is critical to keep the campus clear so they can quickly resolve the situation.
- Keep your contact information up-to-date. It is important to have a current email address on file in addition to home, work and cell phone numbers.


Welcome to the Brockport Continuing Education program! Our program's mission is to offer continued learning opportunities that meet our community's needs and interests.

Please know that classes not meeting minimum registration requirements may be cancelled. Notifications for class cancellations due to limited registration will be made prior to first class sessions and refunds will be issued. Please know that class registration fees do not include the cost of books, materials, or supplies unless noted in class descriptions.

All checks must be made payable to: Brockport Continuing Education. Our office must receive your registration form and payment one week prior to the first day of class/session unless a specific deadline is noted. Please remember that prompt registration may reduce the likelihood of classes being cancelled due to low enrollment. You must be 18 years old or older to be eligible to register, except for courses designed specifically for younger participants.

Refunds, Cancellations & Confirmation:

Refunds are provided only if a student withdraws from the class 24 hours before the scheduled start date. No refunds will be provided after the first class. If you join a class after the scheduled start date, the tuition will be the same amount. If a class needs to be cancelled due to maintenance or weather emergencies, no partial refund will be issued. **Refunds will be processed for courses that have been fully cancelled from our schedule for reasons such as low enrollment.** Fees for registration do not include the cost of books, materials, or supplies, unless noted.

Cancelled classes will be rescheduled whenever possible. If a class is not able to be rescheduled and is part of a series, no refund will be given. If a one-time only class is cancelled due to weather or emergency and not able to be rescheduled, a refund may be offered. No continuing education classes are held when Brockport schools are closed due to weather cancellations or emergency conditions. Please check the Brockport Central School website, Twitter feed, your local TV or radio stations for cancellations. 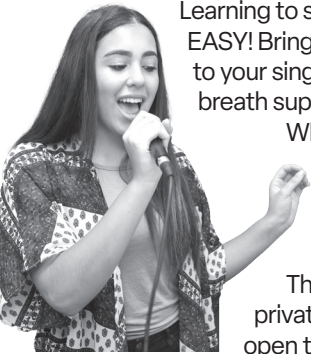

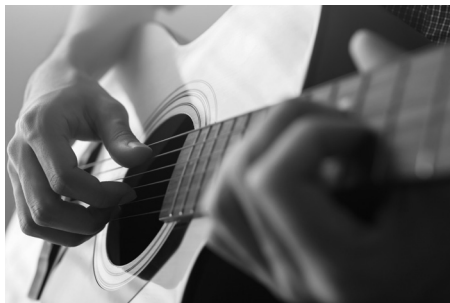

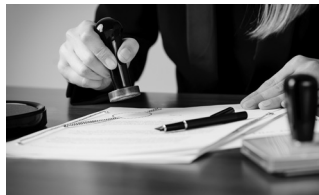

Red Cross Lifeguard Certification

This course Provides entry-level participants the knowledge and skills to prevent, recognize and respond to aquatic emergencies such as injuries, sudden illness, breathing or cardiac emergencies. Participants must be at least 15 years old and be able to complete a timed event within 1 minute 40 and seconds by starting in the water, swimming 20 yards, surface diving to a depth of 7 to 10 feet to retrieve a 10-pound object. Then return to the surface and swim 20 yards on their back to return to the starting point and exit the water without using steps or a ladder. They must also be able to swim 300 yards continuously and tread water for 2 minutes using only their legs. Participants who successfully complete this Lifeguarding course will receive an American Red Cross certificate for Lifeguarding/First Aid/CPR/AED which will be valid for 2 years. 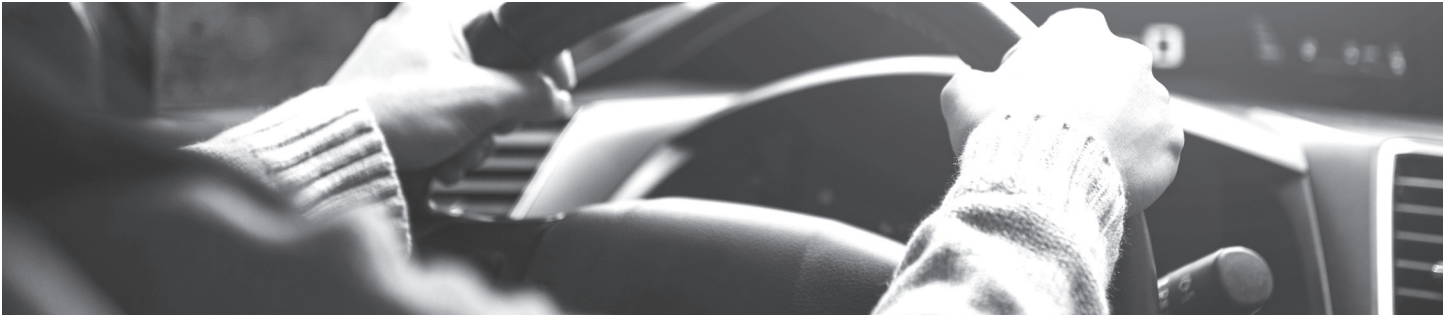

Enrolled students will receive instruction in the classroom, behind the wheel, and on the road as required by New York State Department of Motor Vehicles. Those successfully completing the class will receive an MV285 certificate that gives the holder the privilege to receive a Class D operator's license when reaching age 17, allowing them to drive after 9 p.m. Students must be 16 years old and hold a valid NYS Driver Permit or License to be eligible for the course. The Pre-Licensing 5-Hour Course material is included in Driver Education. The loan of a text is included in the class fee.

Most insurance companies will offer a discount on compulsory car insurance upon request.

Please note: Student must be present for the first theory class to be allowed entry into the course. Please arrive 15 minutes prior to the start of the first class. (Late arrivals will not be admitted and, if registered, will forfeit course enrollment). No early dismissals from theory class allowed.

The NYS Bureau of Motor Vehicles requires five hours of classroom instruction as a prerequisite for obtaining a driver's license. Applicants affected by this regulation are those applying for a first-time driver's license; those applying for a driver's license because of a lapse of a one-year renewal grace period; and those applying for a new license as a result of revocation of a previous license. The five-hour training period must be completed prior to the applicant applying for a road test. Persons having completed a regular driving education course do NOT need this program.

The following regulations are applicable to all prospective registrants:

- Registration must be completed by mailing the registration form or in person at Oliver Middle School by noon the Tuesday immediately preceding the class. There is a seven-person minimum to hold this class. Registering on time reduces the risk of cancellation.

- Students will be admitted on a first[1]come, first-served basis.
- Applicants must be 16 years of age or older.
- Applicants must bring their valid learner's permit to register.
- Applicants must pay the \$40 registration fee upon registering and completely fill out the registration form. An official completion certificate, which is valid for one year from the day of issuance, will be given upon completion of the five-hour program. This certificate must be presented when applying for a road test. It does not qualify participants for reduced insurance rates.
